

### THE FRUITS OF DEVOTION TO THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

St. Joseph Sebastian Pelczar teaches us that the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is the wellspring overflowing with graces from which all can draw; the source which is accessible to all.

The practice of the First Fridays of the month should introduce the Catholic to a permanent, frequent and monthly reception of the Sacraments of Penance and Holy Eucharist, a practice leading to a life in the state of sanctifying grace and in union with the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus. It is a great grace and it makes us ready to fulfill our obligations and our aim in life.

This practice is an invaluable help to us in daily actualizing Christian love, in evangelizing with the power of Christ's love, acquiring merits, and passing on to an eternal happiness in the grace of God.

**IRA Rollover Passes for 2011/2012!**

Good news!

The IRA Charitable Rollover Passed! In "Division C -- the Tax Extenders and Alternative Minimum Tax Relief Act of 2011" of H.R. 1424, Congress, extended an excellent charitable planning opportunity for both 2011 and 2012. This act permits an IRA owner age 70½ or older to make a direct transfer to charity. The transfer may be up to \$100,000 in one year and this IRA rollover will exist for year 2011 and year 2012. Sec. 408(d)(8)(A).

**THY KINGDOM COME!**

We pray this so often each day in the “Our Father” but do we ever stop to ask ourselves what this means?

We are praying for God’s sovereignty over each and every aspect of our lives – that He would be Lord and King over our personal life and decisions, over our inmost thoughts and feelings, that He would govern every part of our being.

While we know that “the Kingdom of God is within us” and that our Blessed Lord declared that His Kingdom “is not of this world” this does not mean that this Kingdom should not affect our life and consequently our family life and the life of society.

That Christ may reign fully in our hearts, in family life and in society, the practice of the Enthronement of the Sacred Heart is encouraged by the Church and promoted in a particular way by our Sisters.

What is this Enthronement? It is a public profession and consecration of our home to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This practice has been beneficial to so many souls and has transformed many families. The ceremonial of the Enthronement consists of the placement of a picture or statue of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus in a place of honor with a special consecration of the family to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This can be done privately by a family who has had the image of the Sacred Heart blessed previously or can be done more publicly in a spirit of reparation for the repeated cry of many, who join their voices to the crowd on Good Friday: “We have no king, but Caesar, away with Him, crucify Him.”

When a priest is present, the ceremonial begins with a house blessing and also the blessing

of the image of the Sacred Heart. The image is then carried in procession to the room where it will be seen and honored. Some make it look like a throne. Others place it above a mantle or on a stand so that they can place flowers or candles before it and/or family photos asking God’s blessing on each member. At this point, the Apostle’s Creed is prayed and then some excerpt from the Sacred Scripture. If there is a priest or facilitator, a short talk is usually given. (Sometimes even a recorded talk.) Then family members and friends who are able are asked to kneel while the Act of Consecration is recited by family members. Friends may join in this prayer, but it is above all the family members who are asked to do this. Then following, there are a few additional prayers consisting of both petition and thanksgiving. The ceremonial is concluded by a blessing from the priest and the signing of a certificate. While it is not necessary, this adds to the solemnity and the commitment to live as a family under the Kingship of Christ.
